Principal's Message

Dear Friends of the St Joseph's Community,

This week we are celebrating Catholic Schools Week at St Joseph's. The students are very excited about inviting their parents, grandparents and friends to the Mass, Open classrooms and Morning tea on Thursday. After Mass at 9:30 am, visitors are welcome to spend time in each of our five classrooms to see the great learning that is happening at school. We hope to have many visitors join us for the morning. If you know of anyone considering sending their child to St Joseph's later this year or in 2018, please invite them along. The school will be buzzing with activity.

This morning at assembly, I spoke to the students about the need for every student to be in correct school uniform. This is especially important for our senior students as they are the role models for younger children. Staff and parents are very proud of how our students look when dressed correctly. I urge all parents to support us in this matter. The biggest issue for the girls is the wearing of skorts (blue stretch material skirt/bike pants) instead of culottes. For boys, it is the wearing of black flat canvas shoes and white / navy socks instead of leather shoes or boots and grey socks.

Whilst I allowed students who were new to St Joseph's last year to continue wearing uniforms from previous schools, I expected that as new uniforms were bought they would be the correct ones.

Today we checked to ensure we have enough supplies of correct uniform here at school. Culottes cost \$24 which is very reasonable for such a good quality item. Girls will only need one pair. Skorts can be kept for emergencies. For consistency and to make life easier for everyone, we are going to return to a summer (Terms 1 and 4) and winter (Terms 2 and 3) uniform. Girls will need to wear navy pants or culottes with tights, not navy leggings or jazz pants. School dresses can not be worn throughout the winter terms.

I therefore suggest parents place orders ASAP to ensure children are in correct winter uniform for next term.

At our end of year assembly last year, I spoke about introducing a senior excursion to Sydney this year. Initially, we were looking at going in Term one but for a number of reasons we have decided to postpone it until Week 8 of Term 3; Sept 4-8. Mrs Power and I are planning a fantastic excursion.

Finally, our next SCC meeting will be in the senior classroom at 6.30 pm on March 29. I urge all parents who would like to be more involved in their child's education to come along that night. We are a very friendly and supportive group. Each of us is committed to doing their bit to provide the very best education for the students at St Joseph's.

I look forward to seeing you all on Thursday at the Grandparents' Mass and morning at school.
